









## **WoAG Travel Advice 2017/06**

Large Electronic Devices Banned from Carry-on Baggage Subject:

Issue date: 28 March 2017

Dear Entity Travel Manager

The United States Government's Transportation Security Administration (TSA) and the government of the United Kingdom have instituted bans on taking large electronic devices into the passenger cabin of aircraft. These bans impact flights, originating in, or transiting through a number of airports in the Middle East, North Africa and Europe.

## **Key Points:**

- Devices larger than a cell phone/smart phone (excluding medical devices) cannot be carried in the cabin of the aircraft
- Devices larger than a cell phone/smart phone must be packed in checked baggage
- Banned devices include (but is not limited to) laptops, tablets and iPads, cameras, e-readers (e.g. Kindle), portable DVD players and gaming devices larger than a smartphone.
- The indefinite ban took effect on 25 March 2017
- Affects flights to the United Kingdom and the United States
- The TSA recommends passengers transferring at one of the 10 affected airports place any large personal electronic devices into their checked bags upon check-in at their originating airport (i.e. an Australian port).
