Agenda Item 1: Welcome

Minister Uibo welcomed members to Darwin and provided an acknowledgement of country.

The Chair welcomed Minister Rowland, Dot West and Dr Lyndon Ormond Parker and noted apologies from the Hon Stephen Mullighan MP, the Hon Eric Abetz MP, and the Hon Judith Collins KC MP.

Members noted the actions register.

Agenda Item 2: Third National Data Sharing Work Program

The Chair noted National Cabinet recently tasked the Data and Digital Ministers Meeting with “improving information sharing about perpetrators [of gender-based violence] across systems and jurisdictions”. This work is being co-led by the Commonwealth and Victoria in partnership with all jurisdictions, with a report due to National Cabinet in September 2024.

In coordinating its advice to National Cabinet, the Chair noted DDMM is expected to work closely with the Women and Women’s Safety Ministerial Council, Police Ministers and Standing Council of Attorneys-General.

Minister Williams noted Victoria will co-lead this tasking. Victoria introduced a Central Information Point (CIP) in response to recommendations from the *Royal Commission into Family Violence*. The CIP collates information about perpetrators of family violence to assess risk, help services keep perpetrators ‘in view’ and keep people safe. Production of CIP reports is currently manual and work is underway to automate.

Minister Dawson noted Western Australia is introducing privacy and information sharing laws to enable safe and secure sharing of information across government and with trusted external entities.

DECISIONS:

Ministers:

- a) Noted National Cabinet has tasked Data and Digital Ministers with improving information sharing about perpetrators of gender-based violence across systems and jurisdictions.
- b) Noted progress under the third National Data Sharing Work Program (Work Program).
- c) Noted project outcomes and a review of the performance of the third Work Program will be considered at the next meeting.

ACTIONS:

- Commonwealth to share the letter from the Prime Minister to the Chair outlining the National Cabinet tasking.
- Chair to write to members on National Cabinet tasking.
- All Ministers to work across their governments to identify opportunities to improve information sharing on perpetrators.
- Commonwealth and Victoria to lead development of DDMM advice to National Cabinet to improve information sharing about perpetrators of gender-based violence, to be considered out-of-session.

Agenda Item 3: Digital Inclusion

Minister Uibo noted the Digital Inclusion Working Group, chaired by Northern Territory, is progressing priority digital inclusion initiatives agreed by Data and Digital Ministers in February 2024. s47B

Minister Rowland noted Commonwealth recently committed \$68 million for digital inclusion initiatives including free community Wi-Fi in remote First Nations communities, establishing a First Nations Digital



Support Hub and a network of digital mentors. The Regional Connectivity Ministers Roundtable, chaired by Minister Rowland, is actioning improved data sharing between jurisdictions and with telecommunications companies. Regional Connectivity Ministers welcome collaboration with DDMM on this. Minister Rowland encouraged continued state and territory contribution to:

- the review of Universal Service Obligation
- the School Student Broadband Initiative
- the 2024 Regional Telecommunications Review
- a new National Messaging System.

Ms Dot West OAM and Dr Lyndon Ormond-Parker encouraged jurisdictions to help the First Nations Digital Inclusion Advisory Group develop a roadmap towards First Nations digital inclusion. Ms West and Dr Ormond-Parker described the benefit of the First Nations Data Map launched by the Advisory Group in 2023.

DECISIONS:

Ministers:

- a) Noted progress by jurisdictions against the digital inclusion initiatives endorsed by Data and Digital Ministers in February 2024.
- b) Noted the involvement of Digital Inclusion Working Group with national digital ID proof of concept activities.

ACTIONS:

- Chair to invite National Data Commissioner to a future meeting to support a conversation on data sharing.

Agenda Item 4.1: Digital ID and verifiable credentials

The Chair noted the *Digital ID Bill 2024 and Digital ID (Transitional and Consequential Provisions) Bill 2024* has been passed by Commonwealth Parliament and will commence by 1 December 2024. The Chair thanked jurisdictions for their contributions to the Digital ID and Verifiable Credentials Strategy.

The Chair emphasised the Digital ID legislation will create a voluntary scheme and strongly encouraged states and territories to progress accreditation with the Australian Government Digital ID System, noting businesses support a national system.

DECISIONS:

Ministers:

- a) Agreed the Digital ID and Verifiable Credentials Strategy (Attachment A).
- b) Agreed to the approach for the Digital ID alternative proofing Proof of Concepts, which will support inclusion (Attachment B).
- c) Noted the Commonwealth, working with jurisdictions, will bring forward further initiatives to achieve the whole of economy goals for Digital ID by the end of 2024.
- d) Noted the implications for States and Territories of the updated Commonwealth Digital ID Legislation, Rules, and transition arrangements (Attachment C).

ACTIONS:

- Chair to write to members regarding implications of Digital ID legislation, Rules and transition arrangements for states and territories.



Agenda Item 4.2: Proposed cross-jurisdictional policy for verifiable credentials

Minister Williams noted all governments are working towards a consistent approach to government-issued verifiable credentials to enable interoperability across jurisdictions and realise productivity benefits. Minister Williams noted that as credentials such as driver licences are issued in state-based digital wallets, it is important for jurisdictions to align with consistent standards where possible.

DECISIONS:

Ministers:

- a) **Agreed** Australian jurisdictions will work towards aligning with consistent, proven international standards for implementing a select set of verifiable credentials where national interoperability is desirable and agreed by Australian jurisdictions.
- b) **Noted** the verifiable credentials policy outcomes and principles, and definitions, which will inform the development of a workplan for verifiable digital credentials, will be submitted for consideration by DDMM at its September 2024 meeting.
- c) **Noted** further work will be undertaken by the Verifiable Credential Working Group on the use and standards for digital wallets and how to operationalise a verifiable credentials system in Australia.

Agenda Item 5: Cyber Security update

The Chair noted the Commonwealth intends to release a 'Ransomware playbook' and a definition of "Systems of Government Significance", and the Department of Home Affairs is developing a framework to assess national security risks posed by technology vendors, their products, and services within Australia.

The Deputy National Cyber Security Coordinator, Mr Joe Smith, noted an evaluation of the Commonwealth's cyber awareness campaign will be available in mid-July. Mr Smith noted the National Cyber Security Coordinator is working with states and territories to coordinate a whole-of-government response to the MediSecure cyber incident.

DECISIONS:

Ministers:

- a) **Noted** the update on implementation of the 2023-2030 Australian Cyber Security Strategy.
- b) **Noted** the update on the Protective Security Policy Framework approach.
- c) **Noted** the update on the work of the National Cyber Security Coordinator.

ACTIONS:

- Commonwealth (Home Affairs) to work with Victoria and other interested jurisdictions on developing the Ransomware playbook and a framework to assess national security risks posed by technology vendors, their products, and services within Australia.
- Commonwealth (Home Affairs) to provide (to Secretariat to circulate) findings from evaluation of the Commonwealth's cyber awareness campaign.

Agenda Item 6: Life-events based Checklist in myGov

Minister Shorten noted Services Australia will work with interested jurisdictions to develop a "life events -based checklist" in the myGov app. CEO of Services Australia, Mr David Hazlehurst, noted Services Australia will continue working with the ACT to deliver the Birth of a Child pilot. Minister Steel noted "registration of birth service" will go live in June 2024 as planned, with an evaluation of the pilot to follow.



Minister Dib discussed a recent NSW pilot of a digital birth certificate noting work is still required to prepare these certificates to be verifiable credentials.

Minister Dib and Minister Williams noted NSW and VIC are prepared to work with Services Australia on the proof of concept.

DECISIONS:

Ministers:

- a) **Noted** from 1 July 2024 the Commonwealth lead for the National Life Events program will be Services Australia.
- b) **Agreed** the Commonwealth work with interested states and territories on a proof of concept for a life-event based checklist function in the myGov app and provide advice to the next meeting of DDMM.

ACTIONS:

- Interested jurisdictions to nominate officials to work with Services Australia on a Life event-based checklist function in the myGov app by 21 July 2024.
- ACT to provide (to Secretariat to circulate) findings from the full evaluation plan of the Birth of a Child pilot.

Agenda Item 7: National Disability Data Asset and Australian National Data Integration Infrastructure update

Minister Shorten acknowledged progress on National Disability Data Asset (NDDA) Release 1. Minister Shorten thanked states and territories for their efforts to share data as soon as possible, and noted all jurisdictions are working together to build robust governance and assurance safeguards consistent with the DATA Scheme. Minister Shorten noted some of the key priority areas for the next NDDA release phase, including housing and homelessness and early childhood education.

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DECISIONS:

Ministers:

- a) **Noted** the progress on NDDA Release 1, including status of datasets for inclusion.
- b) **Noted** the Australian National Data Integration Infrastructure (ANDII) Board update.
- c) **Agreed** ANDII Board will work with the NDDA Board to determine the composition of datasets for inclusion in NDDA Release 2.
- d) **Agreed** ANDII Board provide high-level advice at the next DDMM regarding legislative challenges for the delivery of the NDDA and potential changes to improve operation of the Commonwealth Data Availability and Transparency Act 2022 (DAT Act).

ACTIONS:

- Data and Digital Senior Officials Group to consider future use cases for the ANDII.
- ANDII Board to provide advice at next DDMM on legislative challenges for delivery of NDDA and potential changes to improve operation of Commonwealth Data Availability and Transparency Act 2022.

Agenda Item 8.1: Artificial Intelligence Assurance Framework



Minister Dib noted the National Framework for the Assurance of AI in Government provides common principles and cornerstones to help jurisdictions realise the benefits of AI and set clear safeguards against risk within their own unique assurance systems.

DECISIONS:

Ministers:

- a) Endorsed the National Framework for the Assurance of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in Government.

ACTIONS:

- Commonwealth to publish National Framework for the Assurance of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in Government.

Agenda Item 8.2: Protocol for updating the National Framework for the Assurance of Artificial Intelligence in Government

Minister Dib discussed the importance of having a protocol to update the National Framework for the Assurance of AI in Government, to ensure it is responsive to new developments and remains relevant. Ms West and Dr Ormond-Parker noted the importance of ensuring consideration is given to Indigenous data sovereignty and Indigenous intellectual property rights.

DECISIONS:

Ministers:

- a) Agreed on the protocol for updating the National Framework for the Assurance of AI in Government beyond June 2024 and for ongoing collaboration on the next priority areas of focus.

Agenda Item 9: Communique

Members considered the draft communique circulated ahead of the meeting.

DECISIONS:

Ministers:

- Agreed the communique with minor amendments out-of-session.

ACTIONS:

- Secretariat to publish the communique on the DDMM website.

Agenda Item 10: Other business and next meeting

The Chair thanked NT for hosting the 21 June 2024 meeting.

The Chair advised members the next DDMM will be determined after this meeting.
